Coca-Cola has become a *serial human rights abuser*

The right of all workers to form, join and be represented by a union is an internationally guaranteed human right. Human rights abuses are accumulating throughout Coca-Cola and the Company is failing to remedy them.

- **In Haiti** Coca-Cola bottler La Brasserie de la Couronne continues to aggressively deny workers their right to be represented by a union.
- **In Indonesia** Coca-Cola bottler Amatil pursues its long -running attack on independent, democratic trade unions.
- **In the Philippines** Coca-Cola bottler FEMSA is violating fundamental rights while brutally destroying livelihoods.

- **In the USA** the Coca-Cola Bottling Company of Northern New England hired an expensive consultancy firm to ensure they "remain union-free".
- **In Ireland** The Coca-Cola Company is refusing to engage with the IUF-affiliated SIPTU that the majority of production workers at the plant have joined.

Human rights supporters around the world have repeatedly brought these violations in Indonesia, Haiti, The Philippines, Ireland and the USA to the attention of The Coca-Cola Company (TCCC). And yet today these abuses continue in full violation of internationally recognized human rights instruments.
